In December 2023, the San Francisco Board of Supervisors voted unanimously in favor of the Project 2025 building plans for a complete redevelopment of the existing Irish Center on 45th Avenue in the city's Sunset District.

Six stories above ground with two subterranean levels for parking and an aquatics center, our reimagined Irish Center boasts a spacious lobby that welcomes visitors to experience a host of activities. The heartbeat of the Center will be its extensive library, museum, and digital gallery with educational resources, interactive exhibits, and scholarly research available to everyone. Céilí on the Lake



A new Irish event came to San Rafael last month. Red Barn Productions, the producers of the Great Dickens Christmas Fair, put together Céilí on the Lake at the Lagoon Park section of the Marin County Fairgrounds. Having noticed that many events bill themselves as “Celtic” and incorporate some Irish-ness, the organizers decided our area could use something strictly Irish, so Céilí on the Lake was born and held in conjunction with the celebration of Beltane (Bealtaine).

The weather was beautiful though a bit windy, and it cooled down pretty quickly late in the afternoon. The setting was lovely there on the grassy field next to the lagoon with its fountains flowing.

Strolling around the grounds, we were tempted by vendors ranging from etched glassware to handmade Celtic jewelry to botanical scents to Cormac Gannon’s handmade bodhráns. And a first for me was the vendor selling dog treats, including some of the CBD variety--what will they think of next? When the hunger was upon us, we had a choice between a handful of food trucks selling several flavors of meat pies, a wide variety of “pub food”, cakes and candies, and even Greek food. I learned that they refer to a gyro (pronounced yee-row, and roll the *r* to sound really authentic!) without onions as “gyro hot date!” The Hungry Leprechaun food truck that is often at the UICC for events was there too!

There was one main stage that hosted step dance performances from several Bay Area Irish Dance Schools including The Brosnan School of Irish Dance (BSID) who has been hosting our North Bay set dance classes for over 15 years. There were also areas set aside for poetry and storytelling, music sessions, and even a May Pole dance. Local fiddler, Darcy Noonan, had her young fiddle students entertained us with some tunes and songs--what a treat.

In a deviation from the Irish theme, Pipe & Bowl Morris entertained visitors with their unique costumes and traditional dances.

Our own group, billed as SonoMarin Irish Set Dancers, did a few figures interspersed between BSID step dancers, then we organized audience members in some set dances. Both Saturday and Sunday, we had 30-40 volunteers from the audience learning figures from the Clare Mazurka and the Baile Bhúirne Reel Set, many of whom had never done set dancing before. And a mighty job they did!

After all our dancing and walking the grounds, we went home exhausted AND looking forward to next year!

It was held at the Gleneagle Hotel just outside of town. The long weekend included music, singing, and loads of dancing. Jim Belcher and John Herbert joined us as branch honorary members. We also met a number of people who attend the North America Conventions each year.

On Wednesday night, we traveled by bus to a town called Scartaglen, the “heart of Sliabh Luachra,” for the kickoff céilí. A local band played lively music for a hall packed with dancers of all ages. That was the first of the céilís, which also happened on Thursday, Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. The huge Gleneagle ballroom was wall-to-wall sets—there must have been 100! The battering from the local folks was mighty! Each of the bands, including Johnny Reidy, Abbey Céilí Band, Nelí O’Connor and more, had their own style and all served up rousing tunes to keep us on our toes. Pat Murphy taught the set dancing workshops in his kind, encouraging way. We met set dance enthusiasts from England, Germany, and Switzerland, as well as the U.S.A. We’ve even been invited to a set dance weekend outside Zurich over New Year’s. Is anybody interested? If you want to see us dancing, do a YouTube search of “Johnny Reidy Killarney” and you can watch an entire céilí, where you will see us housing around with the best of them!

We also attended a number of concerts. One was a group of all female fiddlers from Donegal called The Sí Fiddlers, headed by Mairéad Ní Mhaonaigh of Altan. Donal Lunny (of Bothy Band fame), Máirtín O’Connor, and Zoë Conway delighted us with an evening of trad, original tunes, and lovely songs. Stellar lineups also included Jackie Daly, Dermot Byrne, Tim Edy, Sorcha Costelloe, and many more.

Killarney is, of course, a lovely town and we Californians also explored nearby Ross Castle, Torc Falls, and Muckross House, which has an interesting direct connection to our own Filoli House & Gardens.

Needless to say, we also had a bit of rain, but that also meant we had rainbows and some sunny skies. All told, a fine time was had by all!

Our dear friend and treasured member, Lew Milligan passed away on March 20, 2024. He was born in Richmond, California to Northern Irish and English immigrant parents. Lew's wife, Judi Fracchia, beloved by all of us, sadly predeceased Lew in 2017. Over the years, Lew, Judi and their loving daughter, Jennifer, were stalwart supporters and members of our branch. A beautiful Irish stepdancer, Jennifer would often "give us a few steps" accompanied by Lew on the accordion or fiddle. Céilís and "Wren Boys" nights were a treat with this duo.

Lew was a quiet man who loved playing the fiddle and meeting other musicians at local céilís and events and at the Comhaltas Conventions.

He would be seen at all hours happily playing in a session. Lew, Barbara Southworth and Frank Rooney were a "tried and true trio" who played for us over the years at céilís, festivals, the St. Patrick's Day Parade, the Ethnic Dance Festival and for many events of the Murphy School of Irish Dance. Lew loved "passing on the traditions" and was a fiddle instructor for some of our Comhaltas Cooley-Keegan students. He also played the button accordion, mandolin, banjo, guitar and concertina.

At Lew's wonderful memorial, hosted by Jennifer, her husband Howard and their sons, Connor and Liam, we learned so much about the sides of Lew Milligan that we never knew about. At the age of 10 he and his family made an extended trip to Europe and Lew attended school in Northern Ireland. Later, after another trip to Europe, Lew enlisted in the U.S. Navy, stationed in Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, and spent his off-duty hours singing on TV and radio as a member of a quartet called "The Fidels". He subsequently lived in Australia and New Zealand, was an avid dirt bike rider, became very involved in scuba diving, and won several awards for his underwater photography. Lew spent many happy times diving for abalone with his good friend, Tom Southworth.

As evidenced at his Memorial Celebration of Life, Lew made an abundance of friendships over his lifetime and cherished them immensely. He was a lover of music, nature, and adventure. The world has lost a bright, outgoing, adventurous spirit – a person who will never be forgotten.
